NAAC 'A' grade for NISH

The assessment and accreditation exercise of National Institute of Speech and Hearing was done by a standing committee consisting of Prof. B.C. Chapparwal, Prof. Ramesh Oza, and Dr N. Chandramohan on 23rd 24th and 25th May 2016. NISH was accredited with A grade valid for a period of five years.



Online Course on Indian Sign Language



NISH is offering a free 6-week online course on Indian Sign Language (ISL). Candidates may register at nish.ofabee.com for the course titled "Introduction to ISL". The course is comprised of 10-15 minutes videos in each week that would be delivered through the Ofabee online training platform developed by Enfin Technologies, Technopark. The intention of the course is to familiarise ISL to special educators and parents who are dealing with the deaf and hard of hearing.
