MOOC for First Responders

In a significant collaborative effort, NISH and the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) have launched a groundbreaking initiative: a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on Disaster Management Terminology in Indian Sign Language (ISL) for First Responders. An introductory session for the MOOC was successfully held at the NISH campus on December 17, 2024, marking a crucial step towards enhancing disaster preparedness and communication accessibility for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community.

Parivarthan

The "Parivarthan: Parent-mediated Social Communication and Literacy Program," a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative, was officially inaugurated in December 2024. Undertaken by the National Institute of Speech and Hearing (NISH) in collaboration with the Uzhavoor block panchayat, the project is funded by the Kerala State Backward Classes Development Corporation (KSBCDC). This program aims to empower parents in fostering social communication and literacy skills.





Building on its awareness initiatives, NIDAS is making training a key focus in 2025. A hybrid model, combining online and offline sessions, is aimed at empowering community representatives and leaders across Kerala. Crucially, training will also be provided to volunteer support groups, including Anganwadi and ASHA workers. As part of this effort, the training team is also undertaking mapping of disability-focused institutes throughout Kerala.


